Pre-Game Duties

- Inspect the penalty box and timekeeper's box
 - Check doors and make sure areas are free from debris
- Check the game clock
 - Set the game time, run the time, stop the time
 - Set the penalty time, run the penalty, delete the penalty
 - Run the 30 second clock, pause the 30 second clock, and reset the 30 second clock
- Set the game clock for the pre-game warm-up (if necessary)
- Acquire the game sheet from the home team
- Start the game at the scheduled time

First Period

- Guelph vs. Owen Sound
- Referee blows whistle, game begins
 - Timekeeper starts game clock
- Guelph takes a shot on net – goalie saves
- Referee signals reset, calls for reset

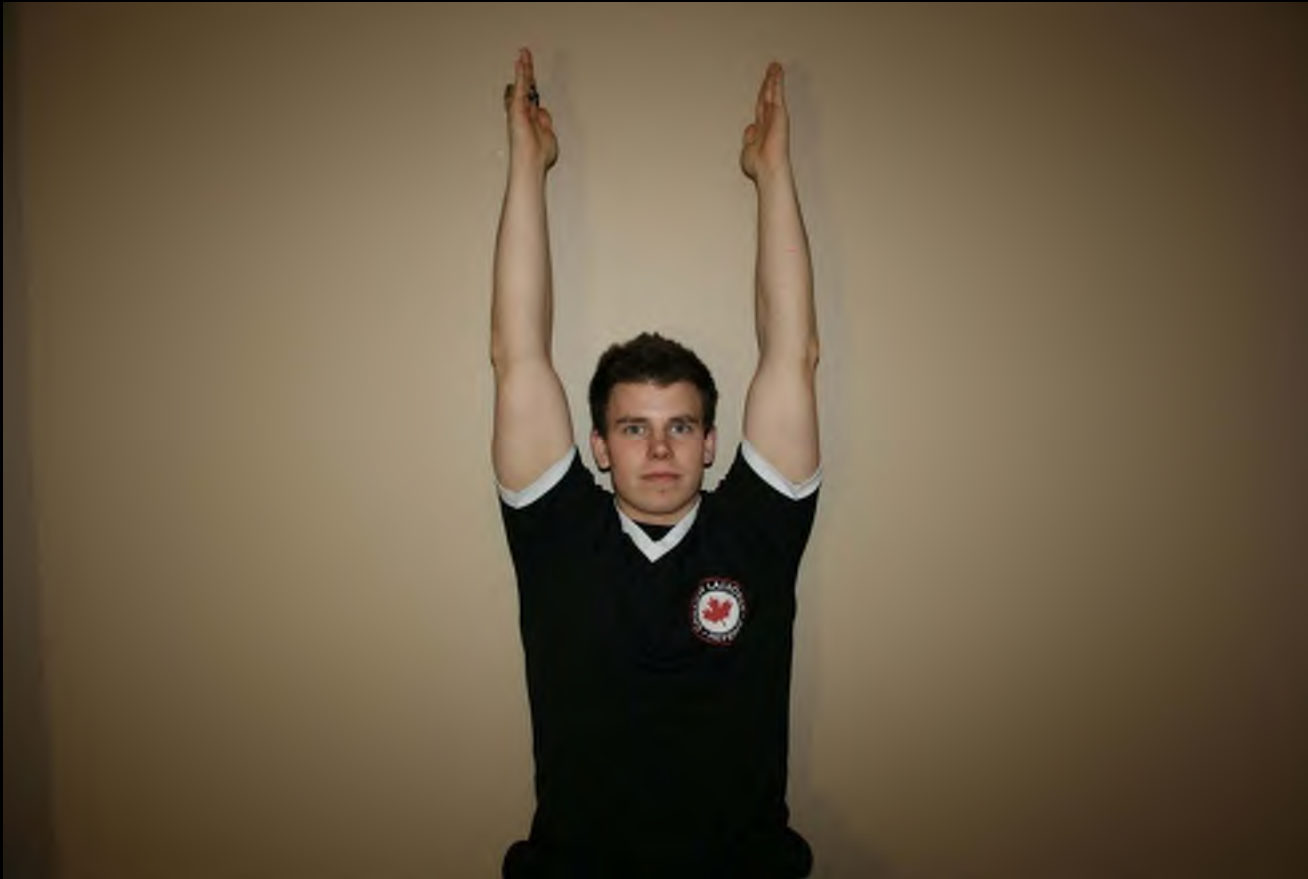
The Game First Period

- Timekeeper resets clock when referee makes the signal, and holds the reset clock until the ball is picked up by either one of the teams
 - Timekeepers should never reset the clock on their own during a shot on goal

The Game First Period

- Owen Sound takes a shot on net – goal scored
- Referee stops play, signals a goal

 - Timekeeper's responsibility: period + time
 - Referee's responsibility: goal (+ assists)

- Period ends
 - Set the clock to three minutes, begin intermission
- Begin checking the game sheet
 - Use the worksheet to check the game sheet for errors
 - Complete Scoring By Period section
- Allow the referees to check the game sheet

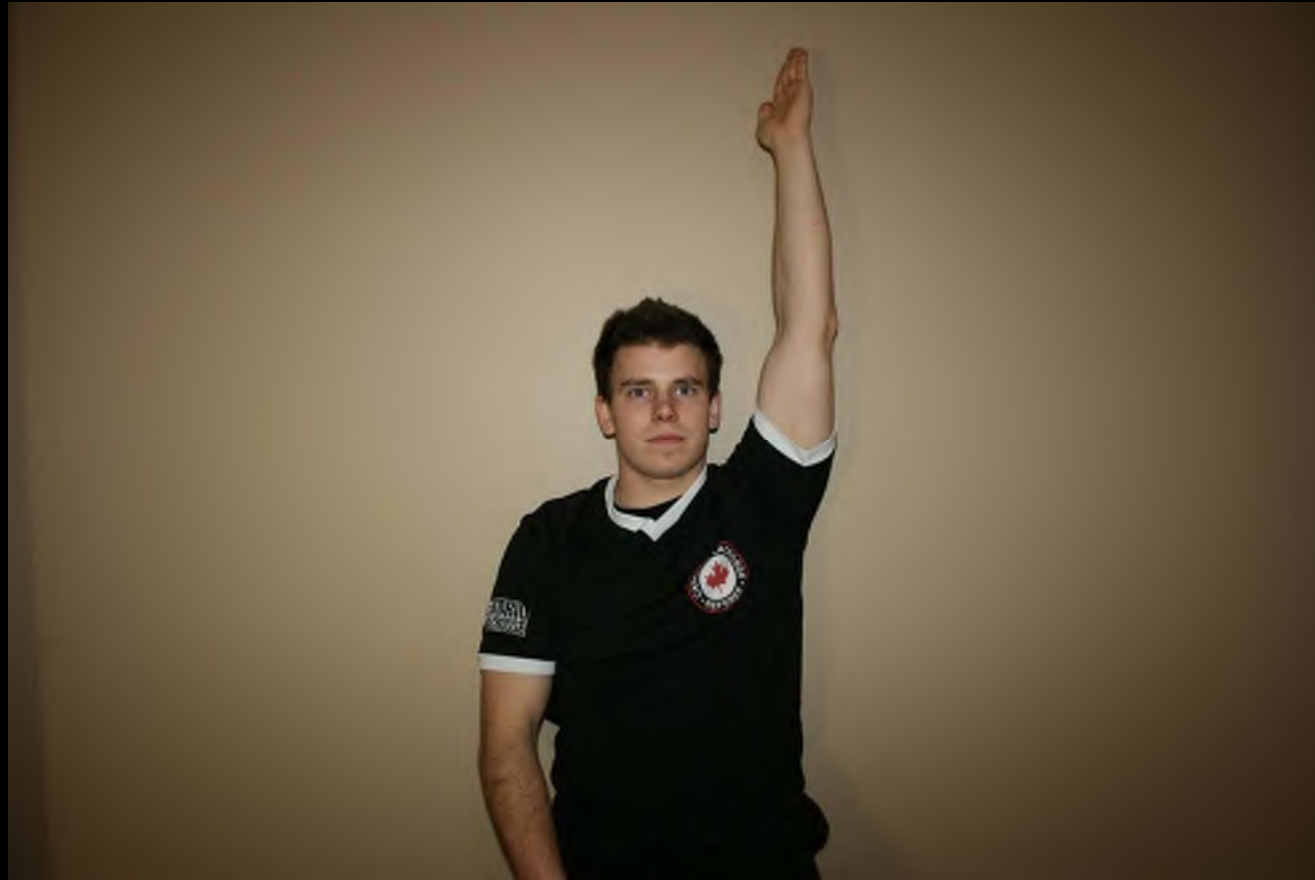

Second Period

- Referee blows whistle, Guelph wins face-off
 - Timekeeper starts game clock
- Owen Sound player slashes Guelph ball-carrier
- Referee signals delayed penalty

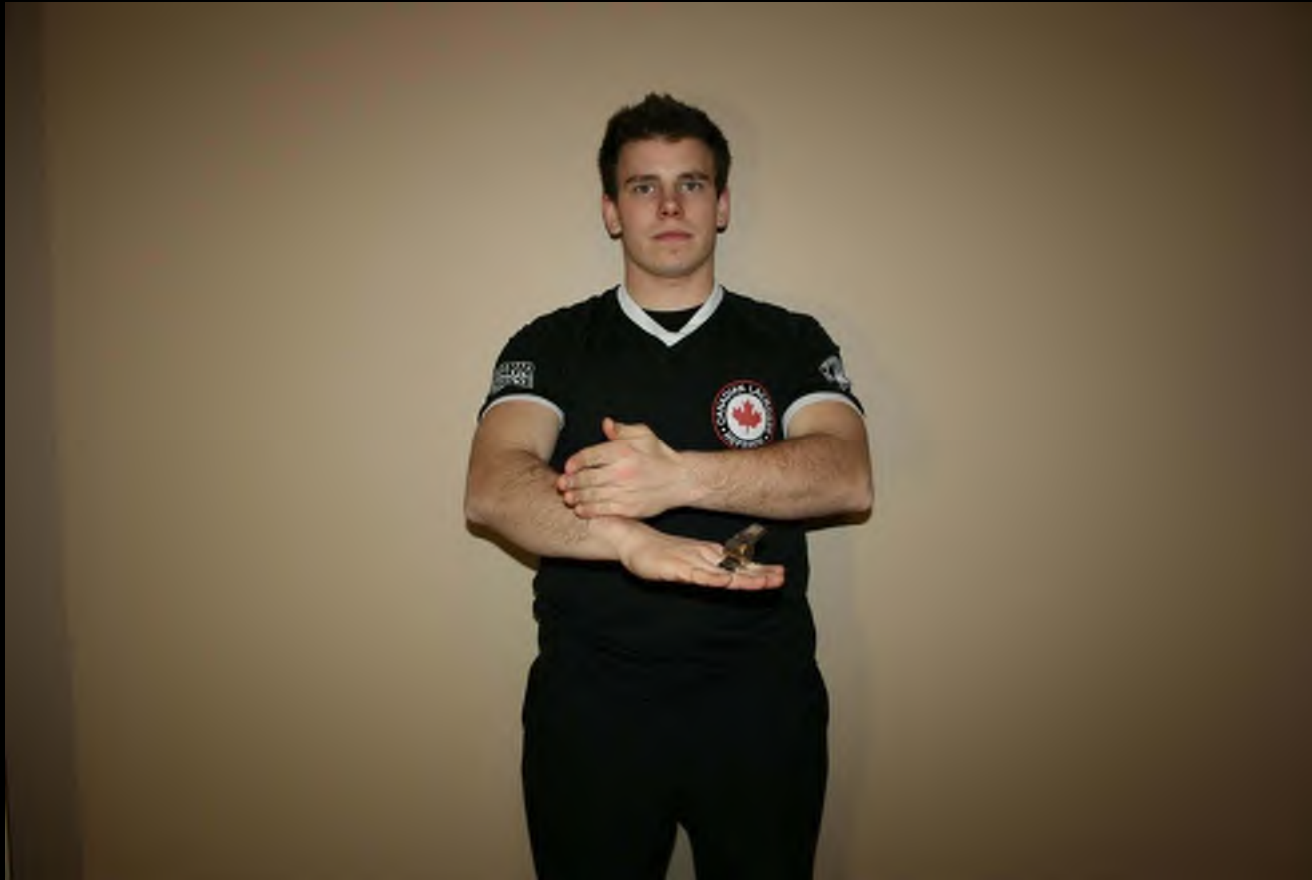

Second Period

- Play is stopped, referee makes penalty signal and brings penalized player to penalty box, and makes the signal a second time
- Record the penalty on the worksheet first, and then transfer it to the game sheet

Second Period

- Recording penalties:
 - Make sure that the penalized player is listed on the game sheet – if not, notify referee
 - Use the standardized penalty abbreviations
 - Know the difference between OFF/START
 - Never record “ON” until the player has left the penalty box
 - If unsure of the referee’s signal, ask

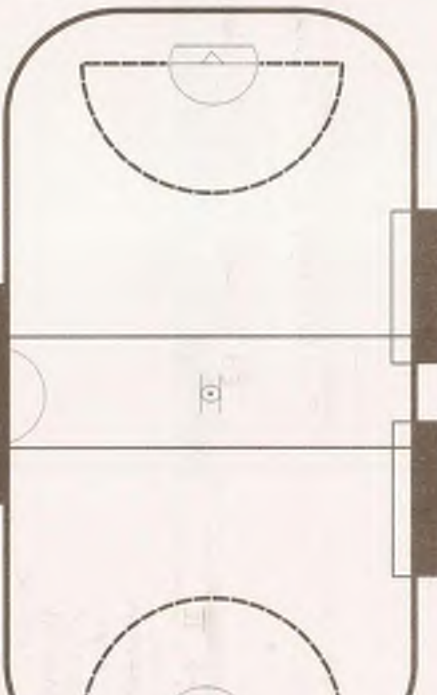

1. Wait for the referee to inform you of the player number, team and the specific penalty call before entering information on the Game Report.
2. Record the player number in the appropriate team location on the Game Report. Verify that the number of the penalized player is correct. Notify the referee immediately if there is any discrepancy.
3. Use the MIN column to record the amount of time a player is to serve.
4. If a player receives more than one penalty, record them on consecutive lines on the Game Report.
5. In the Code Infraction column enter the nature of the penalty. For clarity, use the standard abbreviations for the penalties.

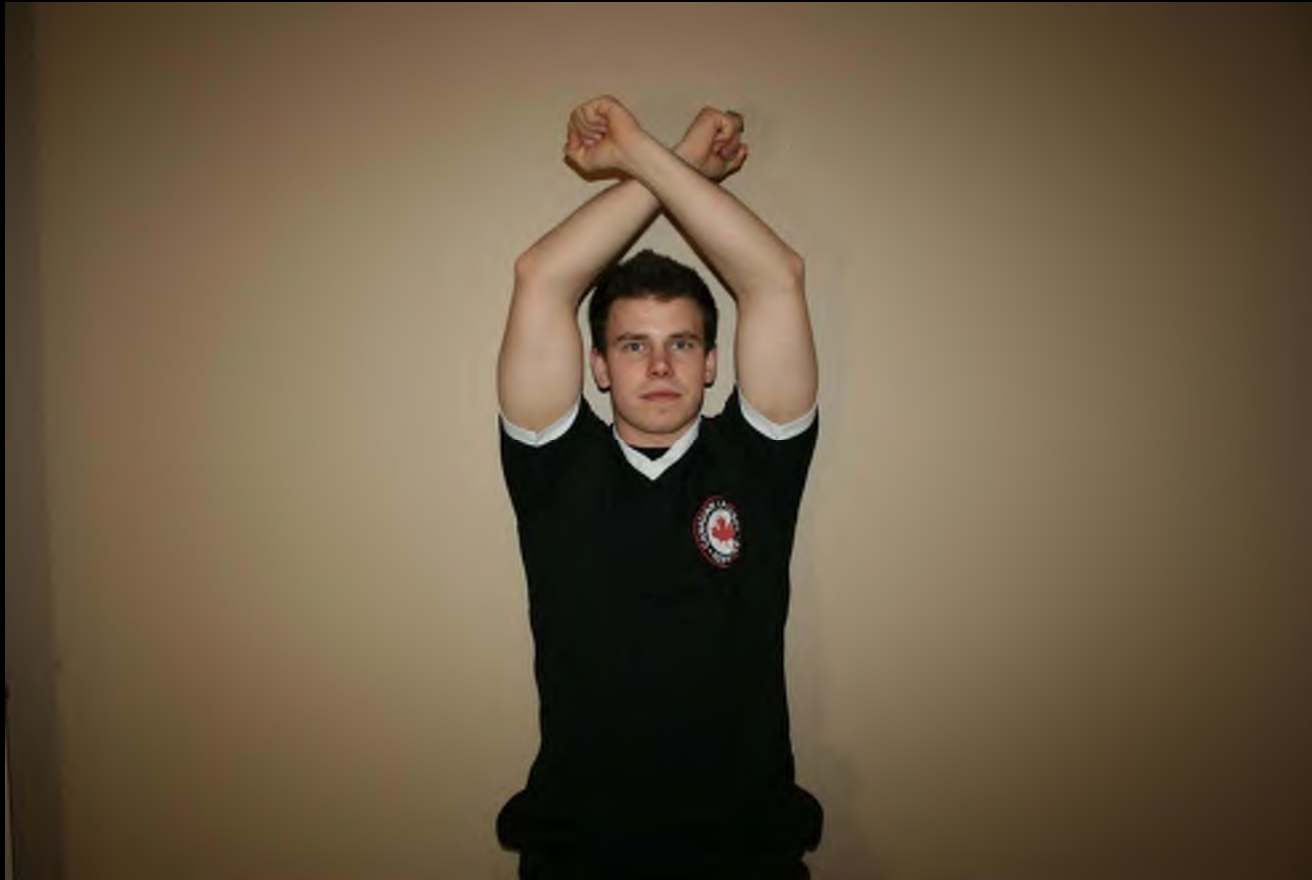

Second Period

- Owen Sound penalty ends
 - Close penalty box door, record time on worksheet and game sheet
- Penalized player receives pass from teammate, runs down floor on breakaway and gets fouled from behind
- Referee stops the play and makes a signal

- Penalty Shot
 - Once clock is stopped, record penalty on worksheet and transfer to game sheet
- Owen Sound player scores on penalty shot
 - Penalty shots are recorded slightly differently from standard goals

Second Period

■ Period ends

- If there are any penalties currently being served, allow the player to leave the penalty box once the referee indicates it is okay to do so
- Record any outstanding time-served penalties on the worksheet before beginning 3 minute intermission

Second Period

- Begin checking the game sheet
 - Use the worksheet to check the game sheet for errors
 - Tally the goals and assists
 - Complete Scoring By Period section
 - Check for players near the 5-penalty limit
- Allow the referees to view the game sheet
- Reset the game clock for third period
 - Reset outstanding penalty time to penalty clock (if applicable)

Third Period

- Referee blows whistle, Guelph wins face-off
 - Timekeeper starts game clock
- Guelph has the ball, Owen Sound player checks Guelph player from behind
- Guelph player punches Owen Sound player, and a line-brawl begins
- During any major altercations, the timekeeper has important duties

The Game

Third Period

- Using the worksheet
 - Note the time on the game clock, but do not stop the clock until instructed to do so by the officials
 - Note the jersey numbers of any players involved in the altercation and their level of involvement
 - Note whether players leave their bench or the penalty box
 - Note any other behaviour injurious to lacrosse (incidents involving coaches, ejected players, etc.)
 - If asked to call 911, do so

The Game

Third Period

- When referee reports penalties, record them onto the worksheet before neatly transferring onto the game sheet
- Record players in order of occurrence, and penalties in order of severity (2 – 10 – GM)
- For major infractions, read the penalties back to the referee before play resumes

Coincidental & Multiple Penalties

- Coincidental penalties are penalties of equal duration that occur during the same play and start at the same time
- 2 minute minors cannot be cancelled out
 - If there is not at least one 5 min. major on both teams, all penalties must be served

Multiple Penalties

- Must be a minimum 3 players (+ goalie) on floor
- No more than 2 penalties for each team can be running at once (if penalties are stacked, the 3rd can't start)
- Multiple penalties are the most difficult to assess
 - Take time to properly work out the penalty situation with the referees

Third Period

- Definition of a dead ball:
 - Goal
 - Penalty
 - Time-Out
- When a player is serving a penalty that is not time-served, he/she cannot be released from the penalty box unless it is during a dead ball with the referee's permission

- Period ends
 - If there are any penalties currently being served, allow the player to leave the penalty box once the referee indicates it is okay to do so
- Check the game sheet
 - Tally the final score
- Sign your name at the bottom of the game sheet and hand to referees
